Outcomes for disadvantaged pupils

During the academic year 2024-2025 teacher assessment was used together with some independent assessment activities to support the progress.

All pupil premium children made expected or accelerated progress.

100% Y6 SATs disadvantaged pupils reached the expected standard in reading, writing and maths and reached greater depth standard in GPS.

100% Y1 disadvantaged pupils reached the expected standard in Phonics
